Telehealth Insurance Coverage Information

- Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, there have been some changes to telehealth and who can deliver it. Telehealth can now be delivered by providers from their home, and patients can now engage in telehealth from their own homes. Telehealth can be conducted through variety



of modalities, including phone calls and video services (i.e. Skype, Google Hangouts, and Facetime). For Medicare specifically, there are approximately 180 different codes available for reimbursement if provided via telehealth, and the amount of reimbursement are the same or slightly higher than if the visit was conducted in person. Unfortunately, as of May 1st, the Center for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) has rejected a proposal to include cardiac and pulmonary rehabilitation services as a part of temporary reimbursement for outpatient telehealth services, however reimbursement has been extended for evaluation and management of cardiac and pulmonary rehabilitation services.
